Men's Shed

Over the past year a working group has been trying to re-establish a Men's shed in Jabiru. This work has resulted in the registration with the Australian Men's Shed Association in December 2019.

Currently negotiations are underway with The Department of Local Government, Housing and Community Development for an arrangement at the Training Centre and the nearby community garden.

The Men's Shed is being developed for the town of Jabiru and Red Lily is a key stakeholder in this program.

Community and stakeholders have proposed projects include painting; canvas or bark, making didjeridoo, making spears for hunting, teaching traditional dance, upcycling pallet wood.

We hope to create a safe and friendly space where men can work on meaningful projects for themselves and for the community. This will assist their social, emotional and cultural well-being and therefore their community.

The Men's Shed will also provide opportunities for service providers to run programs and health promotion activities, and work with local people to reduce the risk of community stressors such as domestic violence and alcohol related harm.

Healthy Living and Positive Relationships



The Alcohol Action Initiative Funding between the Northern Territory Government and Peter Keepence Photography has now been completed.

The program was named 'Healthy Living and Positive Relationships' within the Jabiru Community. The course was split into two groups with the boys focusing on healthy lifestyles and positive relations, and the girls focused on documenting Jabiru and positive relations.

Red Lily Public Health Team supported

this idea from the start and provided education to the students on a variety of topics including:

- Social and emotional learning
- Strengths and virtues
- Health and wellbeing
- Culture and identity
- Families, teams and communities
