

Healing our children workshop



Red Lily has joined forces with Relationships Australia to do a 2-day workshop per week for 2 weeks. The workshop is called Healing Our Children. It is for mums, aunties and grandmothers who care for children that might be living with violence or other stress in their home.

Healing Our Children aims to stop the cycle of trauma affecting children's development because of early exposure to domestic and family violence. The program uses storytelling, imagery, and art to explore the effects of violence and other trauma on children's lives.

We are sharing stories about healing and recovery that come from the wisdom of elders to help women reconnect with culture traditions, skills, and knowledge about growing healthy children.

The feedback from participants was extremely positive and they are enthusiastically looking forward to the next program.
